Subject:	West Calhoun Neighborhood Plan Modification #3

The Policy Board adopted the West Calhoun Neighborhood Phase I Neighborhood Action Plan on May 17, 1999. This plan was unlike other neighborhood plans because it focused all the plan strategies around the redevelopment of the Excelsior Boulevard Corridor, the Midtown Greenway and bike routes. At that time considerable development was in process and the neighborhood became a significant partner by using NRP funds to leverage funds for the many associated projects. The results have been excellent, funds were wisely utilized and funds still remain in several strategies.

With the recent increase in criminal activity in the area, the neighborhood is now requesting to add pro-active crime prevention strategies to their Phase I Plan. Notice was given to the neighborhood about this addition to the plan and the moving of \$15,000 from the Excelsior Boulevard Streetscape strategy to fund this new Community Crime and Safety Initiatives strategy. Open meetings were held on July 11th and August 8th. With the approval of the neighborhood on August 8th, the West Calhoun Neighborhood Council Board approved this plan modification request.

This new strategy combines successful strategies used by other neighborhoods in the Crime and Safety sections of their plans. Because this is a new strategy to the West Calhoun Neighborhood Phase I Neighborhood Action Plan, our policy requires Policy Board and City Council approvals. This is an appropriate request for plan modification and I recommend that the NRP Policy Board adopt the following resolution:

RESOLVED: That the Minneapolis Neighborhood Revitalization Program Policy Board hereby approves the modification of the West Calhoun Neighborhood Phase I Neighborhood Action Plan by adding the following new Goal, Objective and strategy:

Goal: To assure the safety of the citizens in the West Calhoun Neighborhood

Objective: To increase initiatives which reduce and prevent criminal activity.

When the West Calhoun Neighborhood Phase I NRP Action Plan was developed and then adopted in May of 1999, the neighborhood's major objective was to use their action plan to leverage funding to be a significant partner in the redevelopment of the Excelsior Boulevard Corridor, the Midtown Greenway and bike routes. These projects are now in final stages of completion and funding remains in these strategies.

With the recent increase in criminal activity, the neighborhood now realizes that it would be beneficial to have a "Community Crime and Safety Initiatives" strategy in their NRP Action Plan.



2. On July 3, 2002, the NRP Director approved a plan modification to reallocate \$40,000 in 1999 from Excelsior Boulevard Streetscape (Strategy 3) to Lake Calhoun Environment Improvement (Strategy 8).

3. **PENDING:** On August 16, 2006, the NRP Director recommended to the Policy Board and City Council approval of a plan modification to reallocate \$15,000 in 1999 from Excelsior Boulevard Streetscape (Strategy 3) to a new strategy, Community Crime and Safety Initiatives (Strategy 11).

Dear Mr. Miller,

The West Calhoun Neighborhood Council is requesting a third modification to their Phase I Neighborhood Action Plan. When our plan was developed and approved in 1999 all of our efforts were directed to projects with the redevelopment of the Excelsior Boulevard Corridor, the Midtown Greenway and bike routes. There were no strategies to address crime and safety issues in our plan. With the recent increase in criminal activity, the neighborhood felt that they should be pro-active and fund activities that would help to prevent crime and increase the safety of the neighborhood. Using models from other neighborhoods, the "Community Crime and Safety Initiatives" strategy was developed.

After developing this modification notice was given in our newsletters that this was to be discussed at our July and August board meetings. At the August 8th meeting the modification was adopted as follows:

Modify the West Calhoun Neighborhood Phase I Neighborhood Action Plan as follows and move \$15,000 from Strategy #3, "Neighborhood Corridors" to fund this action.

1) Add the following Goal and Objective to page 9 of the West Calhoun Neighborhood Phase I Neighborhood Action Plan
