

Dear Neighborhood Leaders,

This past Sunday, April 19, 2009, representatives for 53 neighborhoods discussed and voted on a process for electing neighborhood representatives to the new City established Neighborhood and Community Engagement Commission (NCEC). The meeting was very productive and we wanted to fill you in on the OUTCOMES and to highlight the NEXT STEPS.

## OUTCOMES:

- Neighborhood representatives identified [Option #1 as amended](#) (8 geographic districts based on population) as the top option. For details about this and the other options discussed visit the [NCEC Neighborhood appointments process](#) on the City's NCEC Web site.
- A [timeline](#) for having all NCEC representatives seated by June 23<sup>rd</sup> was overwhelmingly approved.
- The voting process will consist of one vote per neighborhood. Neighborhood organizations which include more than one neighborhood will have a corresponding number of votes.
- Interested neighborhood representatives signed up to be part of an election task force to work out some of the election details, assist with outreach and to provide communication to the neighborhoods.

## NEXT STEPS:

The overwhelming majority at the April 19<sup>th</sup> meeting have endorsed [Option #1 as amended](#). Your neighborhood organization can still cast a vote if you were not represented at the meeting.

- For the neighborhood organizations unrepresented at the meeting please submit your vote **BEFORE May 8, 2009**.
- The four options for the final round of voting included Option 1 as amended, Option 3, Option 7, and Option 8. Visit the City's [NCEC Web site](#) to review the options.
- Voters were given two choices (2 points for 1<sup>st</sup> choice and 1 point for 2<sup>nd</sup> choice) so if you decide to submit a vote, please make sure to identify your first and second choices.
- Submit votes to [Community.Engagement@ci.minneapolis.mn.us](mailto:Community.Engagement@ci.minneapolis.mn.us).
- There were also a few folks in attendance that did not have the authority to cast a binding vote for a district model. If you would like to amend your vote please let us know so that we can avoid giving double votes to any neighborhood.
- The first meeting of the NCEC will be on June 23<sup>rd</sup>. The April and May NCEC meetings have been cancelled.

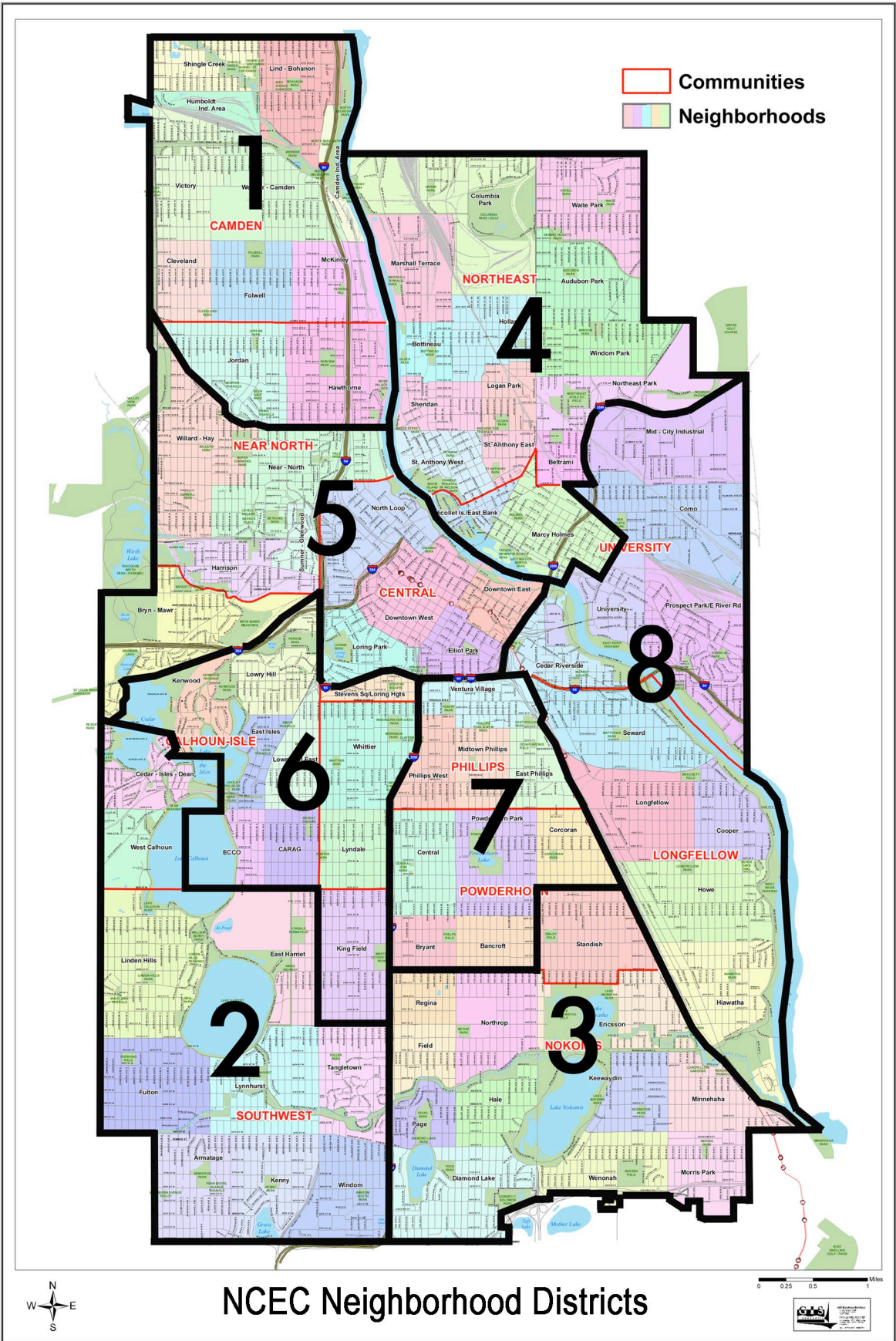
