Powderhorn Park Neighborhood Association says yes, in our backyard!

The Powderhorn Park Neighborhood Association (PPNA) and the Minneapolis Urban League will host a *Yes, In Our Backyard* groundbreaking celebration for a six-unit affordable housing development at 2:00 p.m. on September 21 at E. 35th St. and Bloomington Ave. S.

The new housing development, to be built on a former Super America site, will be comprised of two 3-bedroom units and four 4-bedroom units. All six of the units represent replacement housing under the Hollman consent decree.

Residents and business owners involved in the project say planning for the project was not always pleasant, but that consensus was eventually built around the idea to welcome public housing to the neighborhood. PPNA invested \$82,000 of NRP funds in the \$1 million project. Construction on the housing development will begin in October.

2003 NRP Policy Board candidate filing deadline September 23

Time is running out for people who are planning to run for a seat on the 2003 NRP Policy Board. Candidate filing forms **MUST** be received at the office of the League of Women Voters (LWV) of Minneapolis no later than noon, Monday, September 23, 2002. The LWV office is located at 81 S. 9th Street, Suite 335.

Filing forms can be obtained at neighborhood organization offices, Minneapolis Public Libraries, and the Minneapolis City Clerk's Office, 304 City Hall. You can also receive filing forms by calling the LWV at 612-333-6319 or visiting the NRP web site at www.nrp.org/R2/News/NewsArch/2002/20020820.html. Candidates must be a resident of the appropriate neighborhood category (i.e protection, revitalization,

redirection) for a minimum of 30 days prior to the election and be at least 21 years old when their term of office begins in January, 2003.

A neighborhood representative and alternate will be elected for each of the three neighborhood categories and the at-large category. Election proceedings including candidate forums will begin at 6:30 p.m. on Thursday, November 21, 2002.

Enacted into law in 1977, the Community Reinvestment Act (CRA) encourages banks to help meet the credit needs of the communities in which they operate. Banks are evaluated on their level of engagement in local community development initiatives, including housing and economic development for low- and moderate-income individuals and areas. Presenter Margaret Tyndall of the Federal Reserve Bank of Minneapolis will tell you how your organization can use the CRA to form partnerships with banks in your neighborhood.

Getting to the Bottom of the Ballot is a voter education initiative recently launched by the Southwest Citizens for Civic Engagement. While residents in southwest Minneapolis have 80 to 90 percent voter turnout for federal elections, the percentage drops to nearly 50

percent for local general elections and nearly 35 percent for local primary elections. Southwest Citizens for Civic Engagement is focusing its efforts on the upcoming primary (Tuesday, September 10, 2002) and general (Tuesday, November 5, 2002) elections so that Minneapolis residents will have knowledge of all of the candidates' positions on issues. The group will hold a Night Before the Primary Party from 7:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m. on Monday, September 9, 2002 at Lake Harriet Community School, 4912 Vincent Avenue South. Residents attending the event will be able to meet primary candidates as well as find out their positions on issues that matter most. All city-wide and county candidates as well as candidates who have districts or wards in any of the nine southwest neighborhoods will be invited to participate in this event.
